

A Whole Lot of Fun for the Whole Educator

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Yes/No/It's OK

Materials: Three different signs: Yes/No/It's OK , create a list of topics such as types of food, school subjects, pets etc.

Objective: Students will express their personal likes/dislikes and get to know their classmates and teacher.

Skills: Appropriate social skills and interaction, personal express and respecting other people's differences.

How to play:

1. Post signs on wall.
2. Have students line up on the wall opposite the signs.
3. Say a word from your list.
4. Students then walk to the sign that resonates with them regarding the topic that was stated from the list. Students give a high-five to another student at the same sign.
5. Students then walk back to the start line and wait for the next topic.

Example list:

- Seahawks
- Chocolate
- Harry Potter
- Math
- Books

Halitosis Ping-Pong

Materials: Large party cups, tape, table tennis balls

Objective: Students will develop teamwork and strategy as they blow the ball into the goal. Students will try to score as many points as they can in a given time period.

Skills: Team building, strategy, teamwork

How to play:

1. Organize desks in a 'runway' formation.
2. Divide students into about three equal teams. Students will stand on both sides of the desks.
3. Take a cup on one end of the 'runway'.
4. On the teacher's signal, students try to blow the ball into the cup to score a goal. Students cannot use their hands, only to pick up the ball when it falls to the ground.
5. The team will try to score as many points as possible in a given time period.
